And it is the infantrymen of the Second World War [] from all sides, Allied and Axis [] who are the subject of this highly illustrated history. It uses over 400 wartime photographs plus contemporary documents and other illustrations to show the developments in equipment, training and tactical techniques and to give an insight into the experience of the infantry soldier during the conflict. The result is a thorough, detailed and revealing portrait of infantry warfare over seventy years ago.
