Differential Diagnosis of Pediatric Fever: Serious Bacterial Illness (SBI): 1) UTI and pyelonephritis. Most common cause of SBI; Accounts for 3-8% of uncharacterized fevers; Female > male, uncircumcised > circumcised; Consider BCx, CSF evaluation as 5-10% bacteremic at presentation; Urinalysis: LE 75% specificity, Nitrites 97% specificity

Differential diagnosis of Pyrexia of Unknown Origin (PUO) Common differential diagnoses of pyrexia of unknown origin – for doctors, medical student exams, finals and MRCP PACES. Infective. Bacterial (essentially any organ, in approximate order of frequency): Pneumonia; Urinary tract infection; Cellulitis (or line infection) ENT; Abdominal/pelvic abscess

Basic diagnostic procedure and difficulties. The differential diagnoses of granulomatous lung disease are listed in table 1.
