70% is the mark to get a 7 (approximately). 4% of IB Psych' students get 7s. 46 marks are available in Paper One. 32/46 will get you 70%. So by looking at the above numbers, let's see one possible way of getting 70%: 5/8 for all three SARs = 15 for Part A. 17/22 for the essay = 32/46 Total Part A+B = 70% = 7! Here's another:

Your Paper 1 and Paper 2 extended response answers must get very near to full marks in the IB Psychology examinations. To achieve full marks you need great content. Each of the extended response question (ERQ) answers in your IB Psychology exams will be marked out of a total of 22 marks and judged against only three criteria, of which, knowledge and critical thinking are key (see below).

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Below is one of the markband descriptors IB Psychology examiners are using to mark you Short Answer Questions (i.e. those three 8 mark questions in the Paper 1 exam). Not addressing the command term will limit your maximum mark to 6 marks, instead of the full 8 had your answer effectively addressed the command term.

The internal assessment for SL contains 20 possible marks, so each mark is multiplied by 1.25 for points counted towards your overall score (which is out of 100). External Assessment is 75% of the overall grade. This is split between paper 1 (50%) and paper 2 (25%). Paper 1 is worth a total of 46 marks (3 SAQs each worth 8 marks and one long essay worth 22 marks) so each mark on this paper is multiplied by 1.087 to calculate points for the percentage score.
